

# Worktops

Even units from the cheaper end of the spectrum will be lifted by high-quality worktops, so it's often worth sourcing them separately to give your kitchen a real edge.

**1 GRANITE** It's a tough, durable worksurface and generally comes in matt or polished finishes. If you don't want to pay for the real thing, there are lots of granite-effect worktops to choose from (try [www.worktopshop.com](http://www.worktopshop.com) – prices start from £35 per 3m length). If you want the real deal, a company like Urban Interiors will charge anything from £1,200 to £1,500 to cut and fit granite worktops on an average-sized kitchen. Bespoke kitchen (a similar kitchen to this will cost you upwards of £15,000) by Neil Lerner Kitchens.

**2 ZODIAQ** We're loving this smoother than smooth Zodiaq (a quartz composite) worksurface in Concrete Grey, a new colour from Zodiaq's Concrete Block matt colour range. Developed by DuPont, the people behind Corian, it's reliable and long-lasting, so well worth the money – £300 per linear metre.
